Minutes November 7, 2024

Regina reports that it is fun! You don’t have to stay on the entire time. It will be the third Thursday of the month.

Jessica Drugg will be teaching the Laura Heine technique on December 7 from 10 to 2. Information was on the table.

KCQRF: Diane Burnett shared that our guild needs a coordinator for the guilds display. Think of someone to be the spot light quilter. Nominate someone who represents the guild and helps with our activities. There will be a form for this soon. Follow KCQRF Facebook and website. Things will be coming up in January. One January 6, you will be able to enter quilts and take classes. Probably sign up for job at the show in February. Many challenges this year. Women in Soccer. A line of fabric is available in some stores around town. Mini blocks designed by Everyday Designs – make an original design from little blocks \$10 fee to enter Generation Stitch – for youth and young adults 19 to 25. \$10 fee to enter and can be other things besides quilts \$25 entry fee for judged quilts Artison and Master Lunch and learn lectures are planned. Our guild job is “judged quilts” Capping at 150 this year instead of 100. Cee mentioned that sitting with the judge can help the quilter learn about good quilts.
