Minutes October 3, 2024

Jackie McLean, evening president, welcomed 44 members and two guests, in the AM. The PM meeting had 16 members and 0 guests.

Member Updates: Shasta Reynolds was at the quilt show. Connie Epp will have a hip replacement on Oct 14th. Regina York is recovering from her surgery. Elaine Elliot will be having a garage sale today, Friday, and Saturday starting at noon. Sue South is downsizing and several boxes and totes will be available at next year's garage sale.

After a motion from Diane Burnett and a second from Cindy Toburen, the minutes from September were approved in the morning. In the evening, a motion from Cindy Toburen and a second from Laura Davids.

Cee Kueser shared the treasurer's report. The quilt show income included \$1258.00 from admission, \$1020.00 from the basket raffles, \$946.00 from the boutique, \$980.00 from the silent auction and \$175.00 from vendor fees. Expenses included \$500.00 for hall rental, \$150.00 for judge's fee, \$625.00 for labor, \$141.37 for miscellaneous, \$59.25 plaques, \$21.90 for printing, \$611.75 for ribbons, \$850.00 for storage. \$2156.74 was added to our account with a total of \$19,193.00 total. Nancy Hart-Kline moved and Jane Drugg seconded that the report be approved as read in the morning. In the evening, Rebecca Potter moved and Jessica Drugg seconded this report.

In correspondence, the Agape Christian Center sent a thank you note for the \$29 donation. Lutheran ladies asked for hand quilters to join them on Thursday mornings. The Kansas Art Council in Salina invited members to their symposium on October 9 and 10.

Upcoming programs: There is not a program today. Next month a speaker from Garnett (who shared about borders a couple months ago) will be presenting a new program. There was a discussion about what workshops people would like to see and what members would like to do programs workshops. A paper was passed around for members to share their ideas. Cindy Toburen collecting these ideas.

The Opportunity Quilt made \$1827.00 total and was won by Ellie Owen. Marilyn Chandler and her committee were asked to stand and were congratulated for their hard work. Cee is busy with the 2025 quilt and Pam Pearson and her committee are working on the 2026 quilt.

Community Service: Although there were no disasters in this area, members were reminded that there are many people hurting from the hurricane and they will need some quilts. KCRQF: The group passed a vote to give a portion of the profits for the members of the board. 60% will be split between all the guilds and 40% will be based upon guild participation. The price of tickets, classes, and merchandise are where the funds come from. It was mentioned that when members put up the quilts, there should be a sign up to show participation. Nancy Hart-Kline reminded us to comment online, "This is a beautiful quilt; I'd like to see it in person at the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival, in June."

Quilt Show: Branda Jenkins was our chairperson. Janna Renner was our featured quilter. There were lots of compliments at the show, and many ribbons won by a variety of people. Kathy Halvelka won Best of Show and Viewers Choice. Kathy Scott won Members Choice. There were 166 entries from 61 different people. So much talent! Kathy Halvelka made wonderful ribbons for 21 fun awards. Eight were celebrity awards from community organizers who chose their favorite quilt. We need someone to take over vendors for next year, data entry, and shadow Ben Halvelka for quilt arrangement. Thanks to Cindy Wilbur for the outstanding bed turning portion of the show - for this year and other years. So good!

Challenge for 2025 is using a panel. Find a panel and do something with it. If you cut it all up, take a picture first. Cindy Toburen has a lot of panels which will be available on the farm tour.
